Whether or not you choose to do that, please do keep—and use at home—an ongoing notebook to jog your memory. For older and more advanced students, even

if your teacher is making some notes for you, please make notes of your own immediately following the lesson or as soon as you can—your own notes will greatly help to clarify your practice procedures for you for the rest of the week.

If an activity's purpose or procedure is unclear, please ask! Your questions are appreciated, and we want you to be able to do the exercises—with understanding—at home daily. Really, lessons and groups exist in order to help you know what to do the rest of the week at home. Since you are at home more than you are in lessons and groups, how you use your practice time at home is crucial. Therefore, please take notes in individual lessons and groups in order to maximize your time—and your progress.
